### [PROPERTIES]

**Traits:** Freeze-dried powder

Buffer formulation: PBS, pH7.4, containing 0.01% SKL, 5% Trehalose .

Original Concentration: 200µg/mL

Applications: Positive Control; Immunogen; SDS-PAGE; WB.

(May be suitable for use in other assays to be determined by the end user.)

Predicted isoelectric point: 8.3

Predicted Molecular Mass: 40.1kDa

Accurate Molecular Mass: 42kDa as determined by SDS-PAGE reducing conditions.

### [ <u>USAGE</u> ]

Reconstitute in 10mM PBS (pH7.4) to a concentration of 0.1-1.0 mg/mL. Do not vortex.

#### [ STORAGE AND STABILITY ]

Storage: Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycles.

Store at 2-8°C for one month.

Aliquot and store at -80°C for 12 months.

**Stability Test:** The thermal stability is described by the loss rate. The loss rate was determined by accelerated thermal degradation test, that is, incubate the protein at 37°C for 48h, and no obvious degradation and precipitation were observed. The loss rate is less than 5% within the expiration date under appropriate storage condition.




Figure. SDS-PAGE
